## Grand Knight's Message:

This month, I wanted to reflect a bit on the virtue of Charity and also the assumptions we can all tend to make when it comes to this primary principle of our Order. As I write this, we are in the midst of our annual KOVAR drive. I particularly enjoy KOVAR because it teaches me (and each of us) so much about human nature and people. I often tell friends and coworkers about our KOVAR drive and the lessons that I personally take from it each time I do it. I also tell them that – like waiting tables for a living – it is something everyone should have to do at least once.

It is often easy to make quick judgments about our fellow human beings and to be very mistaken in them - we are all guilty of having made those snap judgments. We might assume that a man in a tailored suit, getting out of his Mercedes or Porsche, is a very likely donor to KOVAR. Conversely, we make an assumption about the teenager we see walking our way - with his or her face pierced and sporting tattoos or shoddy clothes. "Surely," we think, "I am not going to get even a second look from that kid!" What I love most about KOVAR is how wrong I can be about these very thoughts. I have had people walk out of a store with a fist full of money and not even look my way (avoiding eye contact studiously as many folks will). By the same token, I have seen a young person scrounge around in their pocket and produce a \$5 bill and place it in my cup with a smile and a nod. The KOVAR experience also teaches us each a great lesson about humility. It is not easy for some of us to put on a yellow smock and essentially "beg" for money – even for as noble a cause as helping those diagnosed with mental retardation. It is at these times that I think of the great Catholic examples we have in this area of humility and service - Mother Theresa and the Little Sisters of the Poor (to name a couple) – who do this sort of appeal every day as a way of life and humble themselves as they work tirelessly to help those who are less fortunate and most in need of assistance in society.

All in all, I think KOVAR is right up there with the March for Life in terms of our greatest efforts as a council. These are the events that make me proudest to be a Knight and allow us to not only participate in a noble cause, but also to set the kind of example that we always talk about – for our children, our fellow Catholics and everyone we meet. It is also richly rewarding as many folks stop to thank you for giving of your time and making the effort. Every year I have several particularly nice moments – sometimes speaking with a person who has a child or a relative who benefits directly from our efforts. My thanks to Tim Cooke for all his work this year and to all those Knights who give of their time for this cause.

Our Knight of the Month for March is Brother Mike Purtill. As noted in last month's Grand Knight's Message, Mike has been extremely helpful and active this year. Helping to run the St. Patrick's Day Party late into the evening and then showing up early to run the grill at our Monthly Family Breakfast the very next morning — I think he may have slept in the Hall (not really)! 



## Fraternal Benefits Advisor

Owners of Knights of Columbus annuities are now the recipients of a fraternal benefit called the Medical Withdrawal Option (MWO). The MWO (provided at no cost by the way) allows the annuitant to withdraw all or part of the Accumulation Value of the annuity with no surrender charge, provided that:

- The annuitant has a medical condition that is expected to result in death within twelve months, or
- 2) The annuitant undergoes a major organ transplant, suffers major burns, or is diagnosed as having life-threatening cancer, heart attack, unstable angina, stroke, end-stage kidney disease, paralysis or coma, or
- The annuitant is confined in a licensed skilled nursing facility for at least sixty (60) consecutive days.

The MWO is available once the accumulation value of the annuity is \$5,000 or more, and became available February 1, 2006 for both existing and newly issued annuities. To be eligible, the annuitant must have a qualifying medical condition that commenced after February 1, 2006 or the date you started your annuity, whichever is later.


Please note that any waiver of Knights of Columbus surrender charges will have no affect on any tax reporting, tax withholding or tax penalty that may be imposed by the U.S. or Canadian governments.

There are a number of additional restrictions and conditions that apply to the MWO. I'll be happy to visit with you and your wife to fully explain this and the Order's entire portfolio of fraternal benefits. Virtually all Knights of Columbus annuities are covered under the MWO, and as a reminder, surrender charges are also waived in the event of the death of the annuitant.


