Chaplain's Message

Father James Joseph, Council Chaplain

ST. THERESE AND PATIENCE

Dear Knights, October is noteworthy for beginning on the 1st with the feast of St. Therese, the Little Flower. She is often misunderstood. Many – particularly many men – have heard something about her great autobiography Story of a Soul and assumed her to be too saccharine-sweet, too feminine in a negative sense, for them. But this impression is deceiving. St. Therese had an iron will and a flaming desire to give herself to God. She is especially admirable for her patience. The word comes from the Latin patior, 'to suffer.' To suffer well especially is a quality we men would do well to imitate.

Nowhere was this on better display than at the end of her life. The book Last Conversations records the last few months of her life on earth. In August of 1897, as tuberculosis was slowly racking her entire body, she exercised a truly extraordinary patience. She said to her sister, Mother Agnes, "I have never before had such a bad night. Oh, how good the good God must be, since He enables me to bear all I suffer! Never would I have believed it possible to suffer so much. And even yet I do not believe I am at the end of my suffering, but He will never abandon me!"

When she was near the end, she was resolute in her desire to accept whatever God gave her. "I do not repent of having deliv-

ered myself up to Love," she insisted. "I am very willing to suffer more!"
Sister Therese died on September 30 and was buried on October 4, 1897. And her fame spread astoundingly quickly for an obscure Carmelite nun from Lisieux, in large part due to her ability to suffer patiently, her knowledge that God allows suffering for our good, in order to redeem us and others from sin.

For most of us, God does not send us such dramatic trials. The occasions on which patience is demanded of us are more prosaic – when we are stuck in traffic, when we disagree with our spouses, when our children are difficult. But we can all use a bit of St. Therese's help to suffer well, a bit of her iron resolution to stay faithful in the midst of trial.
